The School Games Mark is a Government-led award scheme launched in 2012, facilitated by the Youth Sport Trust to reward and recognise school's engagement (provision and uptake) in the School Games against a national benchmark and to celebrate keeping young people active, and we are delighted to have been recognised for our success. Following on from their recent singing lessons with Mr Parsons from St Edmundsbury Cathedral in school, the Year 3 children were invited to join the Cathedral


