Reading Domains

Reading regularly with your child at home is still one of the most important things you can do to help them develop in their reading ability.

You will already be familiar with your child's reading log which comes home every day with their school reading book, I would like to signpost you again at the start of the year to the sheet in their log called 'reading domains.' These highlight elements of reading that are taught to your child from years 1 to 6 and are taken from the National Curriculum. Please do use these domains to support you in making specific comments in your child's reading log book; we are very keen to hear what you have been practising and working on at home.

The domains have been broken down into different skills and I have formulated lists of questions to use and ask when reading to help develop your child's comprehension skills. I would recommend one or two questions to focus on and then comment appropriately with the

> number referletter ence at the top of the domains.


Open Event




