- Cereal packets that can be divided, eg Weetabix or variety packs
Dried food - rice, pasta, dried packet meals, packet soups, pot noodles
- Biscuits, crisps Food in jars - pasta sauces UHT milk

(CURRICULUM SUBJECT - RELIGIOUS EDUCATION/ BELIEFS AND VALUES)



Dear parent and carers,

You may have noticed, or heard from your children that the curriculum subject 'R.E.' or 'Beliefs and Values' as we have called it for the past 5 years has had a name change since the start of the school year. We are still using the fantastic resources from the Suffolk Emmanuel Project and reflecting the update in their focus since the 2023 Syllabus Update. There is a new focus on the concept of 'worldviews', so that children can not only learn about the experience of those following an organised major world religion, but look at others who have a belief system based on a non-religious basis.

We now have 2 units on Humanism in Y4 and Y6 which explore the idea of 'the Golden Rule' and 'Happiness' which we believe give the children an opportunity to engage with philosophical ideas and gain an even broader understanding and respect for the different moral and spiritual approaches humans take. As always, the children are invited to reflect on their own personal worldviews and ask lots of questions and reflect - which is why we value this subject so much and work hard to keep as up to date with changes as we can.

What is the subject Religion and Worldviews all about?
